Will and his twin sister, Caroline, contracted a virus as newborns, causing them to spend time in the Pediatric ICU at Wolfson Children's Hospital in Jacksonville, FL. Will received excellent care during his time in the hospital, particularly from his pediatric cardiology team. It was this experience that inspired us to focus on supporting international children who don't have the same access to specialized medical care that our babies did when they needed it most. Our mission is to support international children receiving heart treatment in Jacksonville, Florida.

In the time since we began, the Will King Foundation has been fortunate to support the care of seven children through Patrons of the Hearts, an organization started by Dr. Jose Ettedgui, Will's cardiologist, and his wife, Hilda. As we look to continue this annual support, we are also working with Wolfson Children's to ensure the critical work of Dr. Ettedgui and Patrons of the Hearts continues long after his eventual retirement. To build on this incredible legacy, we invite you to join us in our goal of creating an endowed fund to provide substantial long-term funding to the international pediatric cardiology program in Jacksonville. WHY FOCUS ON INTERNATIONAL PATIENTS?



Worldwide, a heart defect, also known as Congenital Heart Disease (CHD), is the most common of all human birth defects. 1 child out of every 100 is born with CHD.

97%

Of children in the United States born with heart defects receive timely treatment before their first birthday.

85%

Of children in the developing world do not have timely access to the heart care that would save their lives. When left uncorrected, these defects can cause considerable suffering and premature death.

CHD can be life-threatening, but it is highly treatable with the right resources and care and can often be corrected by operations which are performed as a matter of routine in the developed world.
